IN COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

OUTCOMES

To develop Christian leaders with a broad theoretical and practical foundation in Christian ministry.

To equip graduates with specialised knowledge and skills in pastoral ministry, youth ministry or missional ministry so that they can serve effectively in churches and faith-based organisations.

To facilitate the integration of academic study and personal faith and produce leaders with a mature, holistic spirituality.

SUBJECTS

Christian Studies and **Biblical Studies** are taken in 1st, 2nd and 3rd year with a five week ministry placement in 3rd year.

Practical Theology and two of the following are taken in the 1st and 2nd year: **Psychology**, **Sociology**, **Biblical Languages**.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

OUTCOMES

To enable graduates to work in a wide variety of community development projects (e.g., government, NGO, churches).

To produce community workers who approach their task from deep Christian convictions and acquire the sociological knowledge, tools and skills that development studies can provide.

SUBJECTS

Sociology with a **Community Development** focus is taken in 1st, 2nd and 3rd year. A five week placement in a community development project occurs in the 3rd year.

Christian Studies is taken in 1st, 2nd and 3rd year with an emphasis on community development.

Biblical Studies, **Psychology** and **Practical Theology** are taken in 1st and 2nd year.

PSYCHOLOGY

OUTCOMES

To produce a distinctive kind of counsellor: men and women who are deeply informed by both the Christian faith and the human sciences of psychology and sociology.

To produce Christian counsellors with a special ability to integrate Christian understanding of the human condition together with findings provided by the human sciences to help people on their journey to wholeness.

SUBJECTS

Psychology with **Family Studies** and **Counselling** is taken in 1st, 2nd and 3rd year. A five week counselling placement occurs in 3rd year.

Christian Studies is taken in 1st, 2nd and 3rd year with an emphasis on psychology and counselling.

Sociology and **Biblical Studies** or **Practical Theology** are taken in 1st and 2nd year.
