AIM

The Certificate in Community Development provides a part-time programme for those who wish to train as community development practitioners, able to work alongside leaders in the community in effective development strategies.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A Matriculation Certificate or equivalent
- Age exemption (Senior Certificate and a minimum of 22 years of age)
- 40 years of age and over without any school certificate

TIME COMMITMENT

- **For Credit Purposes**
GAP Year : Monday to Friday, 08h30-13h30
OR
Evening Class: Mondays and Thursdays, 18h00 - 21h00, 2 ½ year cycle, commence 4 February, 10 April, 7 July and 15 September
- **For Non-Credit Purposes**
Day or evening class: No course work or exams required. Half the cost.
